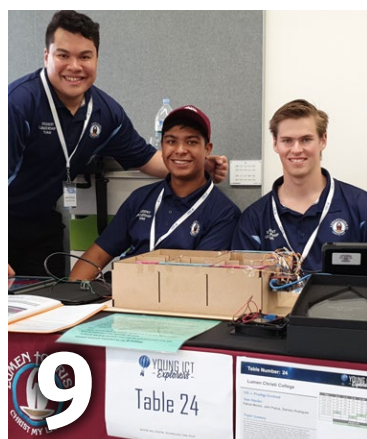

From the Principal

Academic Awards Assembly and Christmas Liturgy

Last Friday, we celebrated the academic achievement of our students in Years 7-11, while also experiencing a wonderful Christmas liturgy, which reminds us of the true meaning of Christmas.

It was wonderful to present these academic awards in front of the entire College community, and to have so many parents join us to acknowledge the achievement of our students. Celebrating such occasions as a whole school is important, as all students have the opportunity to recognise the achievement of their peers. Congratulations to all of our award recipients!

Semester 2 Reports

Year 11 reports were uploaded to SEQTA on Friday, 6 December, and reports for students in Year 7-10 will be available by the end of the day on Wednesday, 18/12. Historically, end of Semester reports have been one of the main vehicles for the College to communicate key information to parents about their child's performance, progress and contribution to the College. While reports remain a key source of information, the introduction of SEQTA over recent

years has enabled parents to access information, including assessment results and comments from teachers, at any time. The adoption of the SEQTA platform has resulted in a review of the structure of our reports, and as a result of this review, Homeroom comments will no longer appear on reports. This is due to the availability of timely, more detailed information on SEQTA, parent/teacher/student interviews and the ongoing opportunity of parent contact with teachers throughout the year.

Change from Heads of House to Heads of Year

Next year, the Head of House role will become a Head of Year role. A new position of House Coordinator has been created for each of the five Houses. There are a number of reasons for this change, mainly related to supporting a more coherent approach to pastoral care within year groups, along with the effective academic tracking of individual student progress. This development will support the strong Pastoral Care focus that currently exists, while allowing an increased emphasis on Teaching and Learning, including academic tracking, to enhance students' academic progress.

Heads of Year will have overall responsibility for the students in their Year group, rather than the students in their House, while House Coordinators will focus on the continued development of House Spirit, working closely with students and Homeroom teachers in their House. The current Heads of House will each become a Head of Year. Heads of Year will stay with their Year group throughout Lower School (Year 7-9), and then a new Head of Year will take responsibility for the Year group in Year 10, remaining with them until Year 12. The Head of Year will be responsible for the development of student wellbeing, which is central to learning and an outcome of learning. Student wellbeing is essential for achievement and social development, and is supported by the provision of safe, supportive and respectful learning environments. Central to the role of Head of Year is knowing the students and their families, tracking their academic progress, mentoring students as required

and the effective organisation and administration of the Year Group. The Head of Year will be a key contact person for parents.

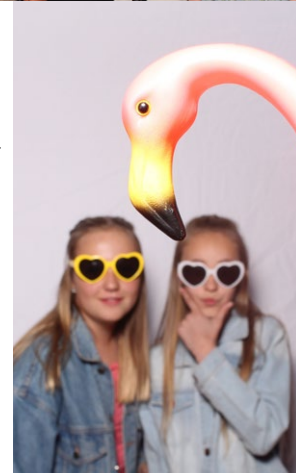




Lower School Social

Award Winning Author Visits Lumen Christi

On a very warm Wednesday, 11 December the entire Lumen Christi Year 7 cohort sat engrossed as award winning Western Australian Author, Norman Jorgensen, discussed his books, his writing practices, and the people, the places and the historical events that have inspired him and influenced his work.

The students were especially keen to hear about *In Flanders Fields*, winner of the 2003 CBCA Picture Book of the Year award, and Norman's latest novels, *The Smugglers' Curse* (WAYRBA 2017) and the sequel, *The Wreckers' Revenge*, both set in Western Australia and the near north in the late 1890s. The inside information about the third book in the series that is currently being completed left students looking forward to the publication of the book.

After the Year 7s had moved on back to their classrooms to do some activities based around Norman Jorgensen's books, the Year 8 students had their turn in the Library.



The Year 8 students had a lot of questions to ask about *Jack's Island*, Norman Jorgensen's novel based on his father Jack's experiences growing up on Rottnest Island during World War II, when the island was used as a military base. *Jack's Island* won the WABRA Hoffman Award in 2009, one of three Hoffman awards Norman has received over the years.

Our visiting Author also made himself available for an informal, lunch time get together with students and staff members who wanted to chat further, with more than thirty dropping by for varying periods of time during the break.

It was great to see that a number of students came to the Library on Thursday and Friday and borrowed copies of some of the Norman Jorgensen books that they had not gotten around to reading previously, to read over the summer holidays.

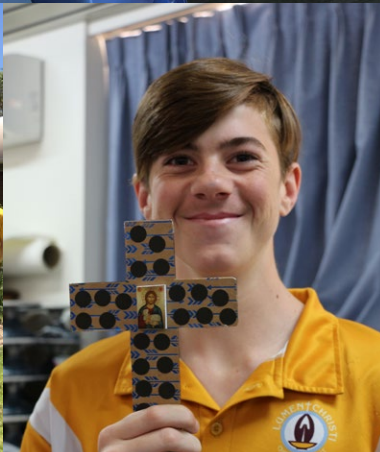
