From the Principal

The huge range of College activities over the last few weeks of this term demonstrate the tremendous amount of opportunities available to our students. While far too many to mention them all, I have included a selection of events that have taken place:

- On Thursday, 29 August the College hosted our [Fathers' Day Liturgy and breakfast](#). It was wonderful to see a great number of Dads, Granddads and other significant adult male figures join with their children to enjoy a prayerful acknowledgement of the role our Fathers play in our lives.
- At our College Assembly on Monday, 9 September, a large number of students were recognised for their various contributions to College life. The environmental sculpture winner was announced, service to Music badges were awarded, and a large number of Principal's Commendation awards were celebrated. Our [Year 12 student leaders for 2020](#) were also announced at this assembly, and the ACC Athletics Team were presented to the College. Students from Years 10-12 were also invited to the Catholic Youth Festival being hosted in Perth in December. A presentation about the recent

Ski tour was also shared with the assembly.

- On Friday, 13 September a number of our students participated in the [Inclusive Sports Carnival](#). Students engaged in both individual and team events as part of the carnival. I'm proud to report that the Lumen Christi team was awarded the Spirit Award for the way in which our athletes participated and conducted themselves at this carnival.
- On the evening of Friday, 13 September over forty students and staff participated in the [Young Vinnies Sleep Out](#). For one night, they gained a glimpse of what life on the street is like for many – having only soup and bread for dinner, and then sleeping on cardboard in and around the Junior Transition Centre. The students spent a lot of time in small groups considering the issue of homelessness. They were fortunate enough to be visited by volunteers who run the Hope Soup Van, which operates in surrounding suburbs and serves the homeless. Volunteers from Hope spoke to our students about the seriousness and severity of the issue of homelessness. The students and staff also raised some funds for Young Vinnies and collected food and goods for the Vinnies Appeal. This was a very successful event organised by some of our senior students from the Lumen Young Vinnies Team.
- On Wednesday, 18 September the [College Art Exhibition](#) opened. This wonderful event showcases the diversity of the Visual Arts and displays the wonderful talents of our students. Coming at the end of the Catholic Performing Arts Festival, it was another reminder of the many opportunities our students have to shine within The Arts Learning Area. The [Dance Showcase](#) was also a spectacular display of talent in the Performing Art of Dance. This event took place over two nights, 4 and 5 September, and also included a matinee for students from local primary schools. It was fabulous

to see a range of experience being celebrated and included students from Year 7 Dance classes to Year 12 specialist groups.

- On Friday, 20 September the College Athletics Squad travelled to the State Athletics Centre to compete in the [ACC Athletics Carnival](#). Against some strong competition, the students performed well showing commitment and determination. The coaches were justifiably proud of our students' efforts on the day. Well done to all participants! The Junior Boys and Girls showed promising signs and state athletes Shevana Pado and Richelle Morales were awarded Champion Girl for their respective age groups and Jacob Eddington awarded Champion Boy for his respective age group.
- To begin our final week of Term 3, the Student Leadership Team (SLT) dinner was held at the Gosnells Golf Club on Monday, 23 September. This dinner is an opportunity for the College to acknowledge the work of the SLT and other leaders over the past year. It was a fantastic evening and included an address on Leadership from former Lumen Christi College Principal, Geoff Mills.
- The Lumen Rocks music event took place on the evening of 26 September. Various College Bands performed in front of their peers and the evening was thoroughly enjoyed by all who attended and performed.
- Finally, on the last day of term, the [Year 12s completed their final day](#) of formal lessons at the College. There were many activities and celebrations to mark this occasion including House Assemblies, Principal's Cup events (Netball and Basketball), a Year 12 talent competition, sausage sizzle and colour run. The Year 12s will be formally farewelled from the College early next term, at the Graduation Ceremony on Friday, 25 October, and the Graduation Dinner on Saturday, 26 October.

Presentation Evening

Planning and organisation for the College Presentation Evening is now underway. This year, there will be one presentation evening for both Lower and Upper School students, which will take place on Monday, 28 October. This change allows our entire community to come together to celebrate our students receiving their awards.

Specific details about this evening will be provided at the beginning of Term 4 and award recipients will be notified prior to the evening. A range of awards will be presented at this celebration, with academic awards being presented at a special College assembly at the end of Term 4. Presenting academic awards at this time enables us to include data from Term 4 when determining the students who are the top academic performers in each subject for the year. As always, we are very much looking forward to our annual College Presentation Evening at which we can acknowledge our respective student award winners and showcase

some of our talented students through performance and displays of completed work.

Students Plant Over 1,000 Plants for Landcare Group

Over twenty students from Years 9-11 attended the Armadale Gosnells Landcare Group event at Poad Street, Champion Lakes on the morning of Sunday, 22 September. Armadale Gosnells Landcare Group conducts regular events to help protect, maintain and restore vegetation and biodiversity in the rivers and catchment areas around us. This is the second event that Lumen Christi have attended this year and was well supported by the College's senior students.

At the Palomino Reserve, the students helped to plant over 1,000 plants around the reserve and along the water's edge, helping to restore the natural biodiversity in these areas. There was a wonderful feeling of team work and community amongst the students and staff, who worked together to plant as many plants as possible.

The students were rewarded for their efforts at the end with a morning tea provided by Armadale Gosnells Landcare Group.

The area where our students participated was fairly expansive, so it may be that they return to continue the planting later on in the year. Armadale Gosnells Landcare Group stated that they had around 4,000 plants to be placed in this area to help native birds and animals establish habitats.

Young Vinnies Winter Sleep Out

Friday, 13 September marked the third annual Sleep Out event held at Lumen Christi College. This year was no different from others, with spaces filling up quickly and dedicated staff volunteering to support the event through providing soup and bread, as well as staying over for the night.

Students were kept busy from the moment they arrived. Mobile phones were removed and cardboard boxes and bedding were placed in the area between M and K blocks. The Young Vinnies leaders ran activities which allowed the students to relax and get to know each other. There were also some activities linked to homelessness which mimicked decisions a homeless person might have to make. Students then enjoyed their dinner for the night. With their own bowls and cups in hand, students lined up for soup and a roll; a meal similar to that for many who live on the streets.

To end the evening, representatives from local organisation, [Hope](#), which helps to support local homeless individuals, came to speak with the students. They shared some knowledge of homelessness and how people can so easily find themselves in the situation where they have no roof over their head. This was a very insightful but heart breaking presentation.

With a lovely moon high in the sky, students eventually settled down with nothing more than sleeping bags or a blanket and a piece of cardboard. Fortunately, on this evening temperatures didn't drop below 12 degrees - a huge



difference from the 5 degrees students experienced last year. Temperatures weren't the main cause for concern, as many students the next morning commented on how little sleep they had had due to noise or being unable to get comfortable. Upon reflection, students were only too aware of how fortunate they were to be able to walk away from the event and go home.

Donations in excess of \$600 were raised from the one night, as well as clothing and food donations, all of which will go towards supporting our local homeless community.

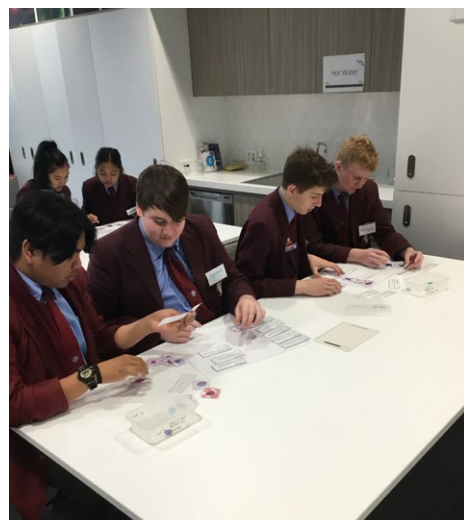
During the day, students gained exposure to state-of-the-art research facilities and potential career prospects in research science.

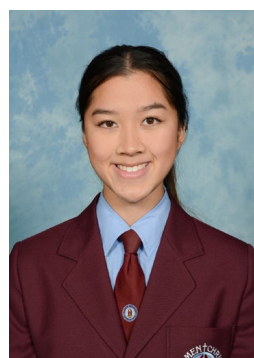

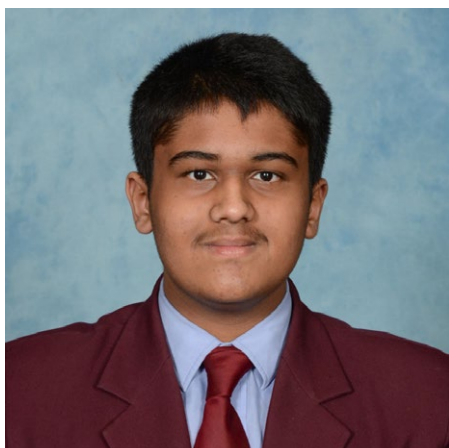

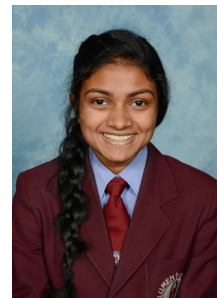
