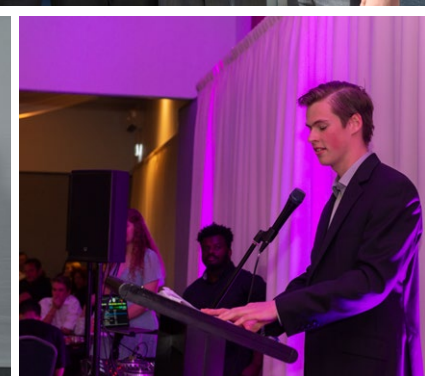
I would, once again, like to congratulate our Student Award winners and thank the many students who performed as part of our Presentation Evening.

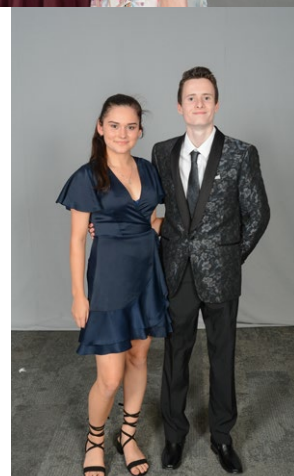




Year 10 Dance

Year 11 Physics & Chemistry Excursion



On Wednesday, 16 October our Year 11 Physics and Chemistry students attended an excursion at Curtin University.

Their first session of the day involved an introductory talk about life at Curtin, both academic and social, by Curtin University student, Sang. Then Sang's fellow student, Rhiannon, spoke about her journey through Curtin, changing courses (engineering to forensic chemistry), her research on fingerprint analysis, and travel opportunities through her research.

Students enjoyed a recess break where they were able to go outside and make the most of the sunshine.

Session 2 involved designing and making water rockets. The session started with a discussion on the main parts of a rocket (cone, body, fins and propulsion system) and the physics concepts (3rd law of

thermodynamics). Students then broke into groups and secretly designed their rockets behind mobile whiteboards, as this was a competition. When their rockets were successfully designed, it was on to building their creations. There was much cutting, sticking, redesigning and creative discussions. Finally they triumphantly revealed their creations and it was time to take their rockets outside and test which group was the ultimate winner.

After a few pre-launch problems, all of the rockets had been successfully launched and the winners were declared. The winning rocket was launched by Ethan Tomlinson, Thanh Nguyen, Deegan Watson, Allyana Gomez and Joaquin Refrea, whose rocket soared above all the others.

It was then time for lunch and we spread out around campus, hunting out the best food trucks and cafes.

The afternoon session was about electricity and magnetism as a lead into electric motors. We started with the theory behind electric motors and their use in electric cars. It was then back to the lab to make our own electric motor. Each group of two was given a kit and instructions on how to make their motor. After many trials and modifications, their motors were ready to test. Unfortunately, only a few groups were successful!

Their failures were soon forgotten as we tucked into red maple syrup flavoured ice cream made using liquid nitrogen. It was then time to pack up and say farewell to Sang and Rhiannon. Mitchell Wise thanked them for the day and then it was off for a long walk back to the bus and home to Lumen.

Lumen Christi Students Awarded 1st & 3rd Place in STEM Competition

Nine Lumen Christi College Coding and Robotics teams presented their final projects at the recent Young ICT Explorers Competition, coming away with a 1st and 3rd place.

Following many months of researching, testing and development, our students presented their projects to judges and fellow competitors on Saturday, 19 October. The competition, which was held at Edith Cowan University, required students to produce a project that uses Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) to solve a problem or share a passion. Projects were judged on their creativity and innovation, quality and completeness, level of difficulty, and their documentation.

1st place in the Year 11/12 category was awarded to Year 12 students Patrick Morton, Zachary Rodrigues and Patrick Padua for their project, 'Prodigy Evolved'. The team has now been invited to represent Western Australia in the finals, to be held in Sydney later this year. This fantastic result follows a 2nd placing for the same team in 2018 and another 1st placing in 2017.

"Our project, 'Prodigy', is a home automation system designed to eliminate unnecessary power usage in the home and to give the homeowner complete control over the function of electrical devices in their house. The name 'Prodigy' comes from our system's ability to generate statistics on the homeowner's power usage and suggest ways to optimise that power usage. Its ability to interpret this data and maximise efficiency makes it 'smart'. We



have been developing this system for three years, with 'Prodigy Evolved' being the latest iteration," said Patrick Morton.

Year 10 students Tommo Morton, Dalton Briggs & Sebastian Darr were also recognised for their impressive ICT knowledge and problem-solving ability, earning 3rd place in the Year 9/10 category for their project, 'Sentinel'

"Our project was inspired by the eleventh United Nations Sustainable Development Goal, 'Sustainable Cities and Communities', which includes security and surveillance. Security is typically undertaken by humans, which is inefficient and costly... Our solution is Sentinel, a security network consisting of many interconnected modules. The network effectively detects intrusion. It is targeted at institutions, organisations and

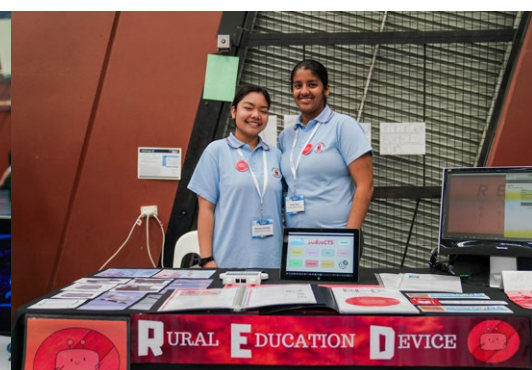
corporations and is designed to maintain a constant watch on the entire area... The system scans for motion and thermal and if detected, deploys a bot to scout the area. The scout-bot pursues intruders and transmits footage to authorities," said Year 10 student, Tommo Morton.

This year's competition was attended by 21 schools, with 199 students presenting 80 projects. Since WA students were invited to participate in the competition in 2015, Lumen Christi College has placed every year, with students working on their projects throughout the entire year.

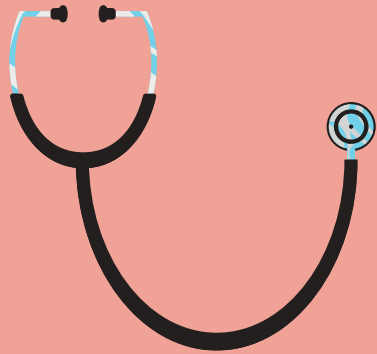

National Computer Science School

3-12 January 2020

The National Computer Science School (NCSS) brings together talented students for an intensive week of computer programming, web development, and robotics. Designed for computing, science and mathematics students, the NCSS is about challenging participants to think like computer scientists. Students also have the opportunity to engage with academics, industry professionals and other like-minded young people in a stimulating and social environment.

In 2020, NCSS will run from Friday 3 January to Sunday 12 January, and we are planning nodes at the University of Sydney and the University of Melbourne.

Which students should apply?

The NCSS is designed for talented computer science, science and mathematics students who will complete Year 11 in 2019. Exceptionally gifted Year 10 students are also encouraged to apply. However, please note that prior knowledge of computing is not assumed. Students not enrolled in computing subjects may also be interested in attending NCSS.

How much does it cost?

The school is residential, with all students staying on campus with staff in full-board accommodation provided by The Women's College at the University of Sydney and Trinity College at the University of Melbourne. The generous support of our sponsors has enabled us to heavily subsidise the program. The cost to students is \$500 each including GST. This fee may be waived in cases of financial hardship.

Students will need to organise and pay for their own transport to and from Sydney or Melbourne. We collect students from the airport or central bus and train stations.

How to register

Students can apply online at ncss.edu.au/summer-school, with applications closing on Friday 18 October 2019.

Can teachers participate?

Yes, teachers can participate in the NCSS as team members working directly with the students. No programming experience is required. Teachers will receive comprehensive course and tutorial notes that can be reused in the classroom and will have access to leading academic staff and professionals. The cost is \$500 (including GST).
